

Piney Lakes Reserve is a significant site for Noongar women. Before European settlement, women's rituals and the education of young children were conducted here. Today this is recognized by the Bidi Katitjiny Aboriginal Women's Trail. Recently we were exploring several walking trails, including the **Bidi Katitjiny Aboriginal Women's Trail**, the Climate Watch Trail, the Wetland Walk, and Sculpture Walk. Students have been learning about native plants, animals and natural resources to all people. The **NOONGAR six seasons** represent a different period of activity dependent on the weather and the cycles of nature. The Noongar Six Seasons are **Bunuru** (the fruiting) February to March, **Djeran** (first dew) April to May, **Makuru** (cold and wet), **Djilba** (cold and rain easing) August to September, **Kambarang** (the flowering) October to November, and **Birak** (hot and dry) December to January.
